## **Maps of the Camp Potter**

The first map is the 1920 Land Lottery map of Land District 1 of Early County (now Dougherty County) followed by an enlargement of the Camp Potter area. (This map was drawn upside down. North is on the bottom; therefore, Camp Potter appears on the right side of the Flint River on the map.) The second map is from 1866 and is followed by an enlargement of the Camp Potter area.

The last map is a schematic layout drawn by the Surveying Service of the Boy Scouts of America and shows proposed camp sites and other developments at Camp Potter. We have only located the reduced plat and the year is unreadable. It appears to be either May of 1960 or May of 1980. The two maps preceding the layout were found with it.
