Camp William S. Potter Patches

Camp Potter served as the segregated camp for Chehaw Council until the mid-1960s, when all scouts began attending Camp Osborn. Since the 1960s there have been occasional Council camporees at Camp Potter and some individual troops have made use of it for camping.

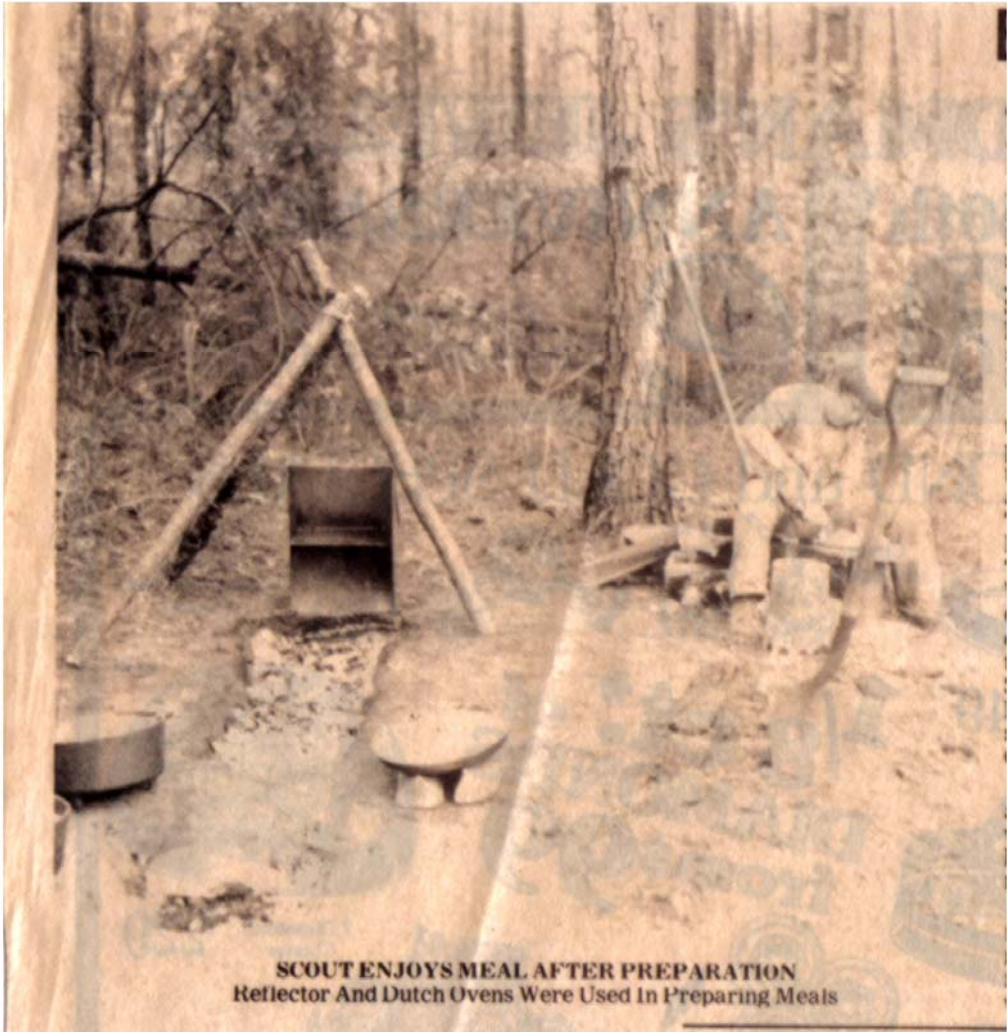
