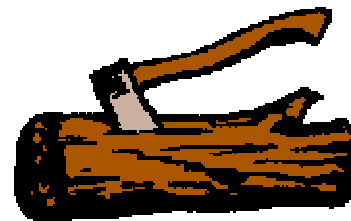

FALL 2005 POPCORN INFORMATION

DATES TO REMEMBER:

- Sept. 8 (On or after) District Popcorn Kickoffs
- Nov. 9 Popcorn and prize orders due
- Nov. 18—19 Popcorn Pickup
- Dec. 9 Popcorn money DEADLINE

SCOUT INCENTIVES:

1. Each district top salesman receives a FULL uniform pertaining to his/her program.
2. Top council salesman receives \$200 scout bucks at the council shop or BSA catalogue through the council shop.

UNIT INCENTIVES:

1. 25% commission if unit sends representative to district kickoff and the unit holds a popcorn kickoff.
2. 30% commission if prizes and popcorn are ordered ONLINE through Trails-End and you designate your units pick up time.
3. 35% commission if all the above are accomplished and money is ON TIME.
4. 40% commission if all the above are accomplished and unit has their own prior approved prize program (does not participate in the council prize program)



Unit prizes must be approved by council office prior to unit kickoff.

Late payments after 12-9-05 deducted 5% and after 1-1-06 deducted 10%

Does your unit use any of these popcorn tips?? **Make your unit successful!!**

- Educate the parents of the direct benefits to them.. Explain why this is such an important fund-raiser, state goal, uses, explain the scholarship program, prize program, council incentives, etc. Show how this fund-raiser gives more back to their child than other fund-raisers.
- Plan a big unit kickoff for the youth to get all their materials and get everybody excited. All the youth should receive the Prize Brochure, Take Order Forms, and money collection envelopes. Review all prizes available to the youth.
- Plan a unit "Blitz Day" where every youth in the unit goes out selling and whoever sells the most that day gets a prize.
- Establish a Unit Prize Program in addition to the Council Prize Program, example: each Scout who sells \$250 gets to go to Akela Cub, Day Camp, Scout Camp, Webeloree FREE.
- Establish a Unit Sales Goal. For example, a unit trip, send all youth to camp, Boys' Life subscription for all youth, etc, then establish the dollar amount needed to pay for that goal.
- Decide on a prize for the youth that has the highest sales each week.
- Establish a unit customer base by reviewing last year's Take Order Forms. Make sure that past customers are visited first.
- Do corporate sales using employers and companies of the parents and leaders within your unit.
- Remind parents of all the great uses of popcorn as gifts for teachers, co-workers, neighbors, baby-sitters and relatives.

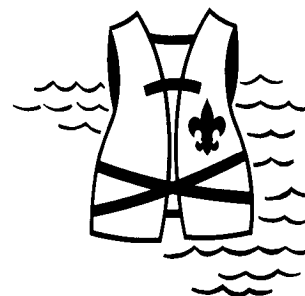

**CAMPING NOTES**

- All units using Camp Osborn must obtain a Camp Osborn Use Permit from the council office. This permit PLUS a Tour Permit must be filed 1 week in advance. The council office has the permit and it is online.
- TOUR PERMITS are for the protection of YOU and YOUR BOYS. Must be filed with the council office 2 weeks prior to trip. They are required for ALL overnight trips and ALL daytrips outside of county residence. They are NOT required for local in-town day field trips. The tour permit must be completed on both front and back of the permit. If you are ever in doubt of whether you need a tour permit — fill it out!!!

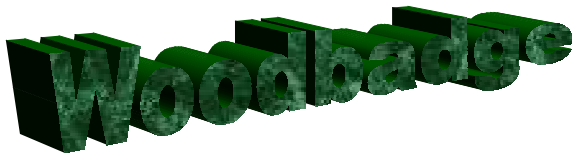

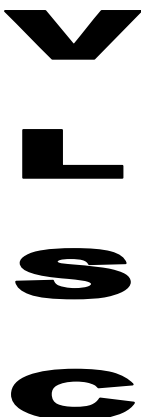

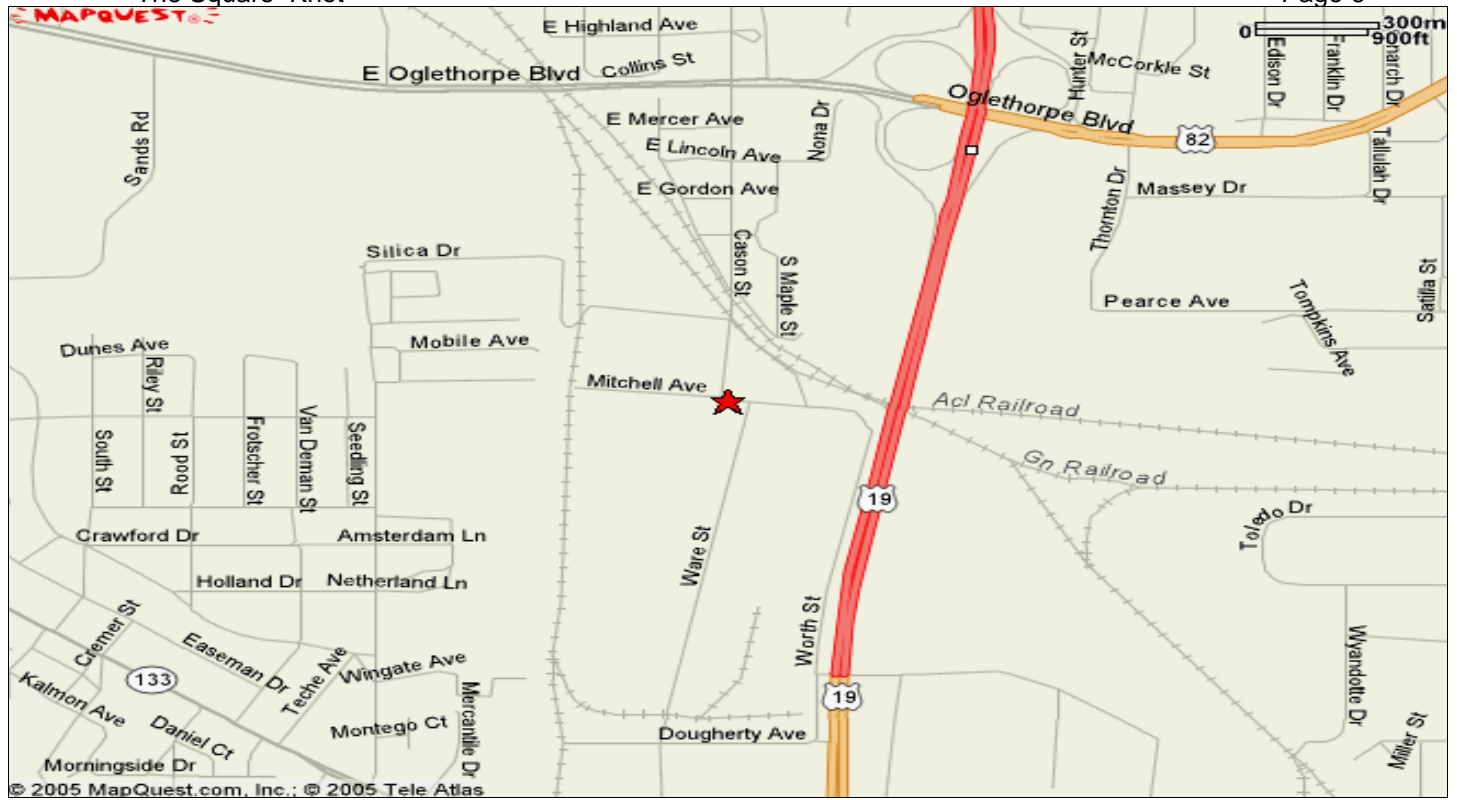
