

District Annual Program Preview Conference





Woodbadge Survey

Woodbadge is the highest level of training which can be provided to leaders in the Boy Scouting program on the local Council level. Woodbadge is not only for Scoutmasters, but for assistants, committee members, and other scouters. It is available for both male and female Scouters. To be eligible for participation, a Scouter should have completed Fast Start Training and Scout Leader Basic Training. In some cases tenure of four or five or more years as a leader may be used in lieu of specific training requirements

There are two types of courses: a week long course and a weekend course. The weekend course meets four times during a two-month period. In order to run an approved course, thirty-two or more qualified participants are necessary. Course costs will be approximately \$125.00 for the week long course or \$150.00 for the weekend course. Target course date would be fall 1990.
