## Nation's Leaders Gathering in New York for 29th Boy Scout Conclave and Great World's Fair Rally

What promises to be the largest rally of Scouts ever held anywhere in the world will take place during Boy Scout Day at the New York World's Fair on June 29. The exercises will be combined with the 29th Annual Meeting of the National Council, Boy Scouts of America, on June 28-29. First day sessions, June 28, of the national meeting will be at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel where Alfred E. Smith, former Governor of New York State, and Dr. John R. Mott, President of the World's Alliance of the Y.M.C.A. are to speak at the luncheon and dinner sessions respectively. J. Edgar Hoover, Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, will address the mass gathering of 75,000 Scouts scheduled for the Court of Peace at the Fair on Thursday afternoon June 29, and at the same place Owen J. Roberts, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States, is to officiate at a ceremony when 500 or more 21-year-old Scouts or former Scouts accept the specific obligations of voting citizenship.

Grover A. Whalen, President of the World's Fair Corporation and Fiorello H. LaGuardia, Mayor of New York City, will welcome the National Council at luncheon in the Fair's Casino of Nations just prior to the Scout Day ceremonies. Walter W. Head of St. Louis, Mo., President of the National Council, Boy Scouts of America, will occupy the chair at all sessions. Both Theodore Roosevelt, Vice-President of the National Council, and Daniel Carter Beard, National Scout Commissioner, are to take part in the sessions. Dr. James E. West, Chief Scout Executive and Editor of "Boys' Life," will make public the Movement's annual report for 1938, showing excellent progress in all fields and a 12.4% gain in membership. The Boy Scout Foundation of Greater New York, host Council, is completing extensive plans to receive and entertain the delegates.

## BOY SCOUT WEEK



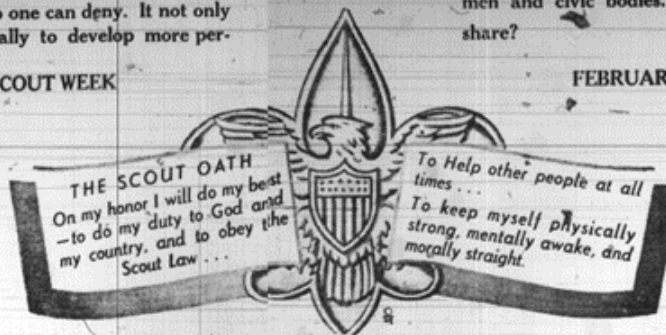

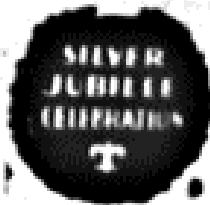

# Americus Boy Scouts To Join In Silver Jubilee Celebration Of Scouting



The first event in connection with the observance of Boy Scout Week, Feb. 8-15, and the 25th anniversary of Scouting in America, with the Americus troops, will be at the Kiwanis luncheon on Friday, the 8th, when Rev. O. L. Evans, the director of Boy's Work for the club, will tell something of the activities of troop No. 1, which is being sponsored by the club, and any plans he may have for boy's work in general in the future.

The main event of the week will begin at 7 o'clock in the Merritt Building Hall on the evening of the 8th, when all three troops will assemble for the radio address of President Roosevelt to the Scouts at 7:45 o'clock. In addition to this address Tom Marshall will speak and the three troops will put on a Scouting demonstration that ought to be of interest to all the people of the community. This demonstration will consist of the reciting of the laws of Scouting, the history and use of the flag of our country, first aid demonstration, etc. For the amusement feature of the occasion, there will be stunts from each of the troops that will no doubt be entertaining to all. All who are interested in the development of the boys of the community should be present upon this occasion. The public is most cordially invited, there being no admission fee.

On Sunday, Feb. 10, all three troops are expected to worship in the morning at the First Methodist church and in the evening at the First Baptist, each troop attending in a body at both churches. The services at both hours will be in keeping with the celebration of the 25th anniversary of Scouting in America. All the ministers of the city are asked to either preach on a topic appropriate to the anniversary or make mention of it during one of the services of the day.

On Wednesday, the 12th, Scouts from troop No. 2 will appear for a program before the Rotary Club at their luncheon on that day, this club being the sponsors of troop No. 2.

The final event of the week will be a demonstration program at the Americus High school at the chapel exercises on Friday, the 15th, under the direction of W. E. Gear, the Scoutmaster of troop No. 1.


Everybody is asked to give their encouragement to this great work, by being present at any of these events, where permissible.

**Boy Scouts of America Present Unique  
Award for Distinguished Service to Boyhood**



First Silver Buffalo Awards in 1926



Distinguished service to boyhood is the basis of a new award, "the Silver Buffalo," presented by the Boy Scouts of America for the first time in the history of the organization, at the recent National Council Meeting, held in Washington, D. C. The award is a solid silver miniature buffalo suspended by a  $\frac{1}{2}$  width of red and white ribbon to be worn around the neck.

The following prominent laymen and scout officials received the unique award:

(1) Lt. General Sir Robert S. S. Baden-Powell, founder of the British Boy Scouts' Association, and "Chief Scout of the World"; (2) William D. Boyce, incorporator of the Boy Scouts of America; (3) Collin H. Livingstone, former President, B.S.A., serving 15 consecutive years; (4) James J. Storrow, late President, B.S.A. (award made to the Storrow family); (5) Daniel Carter Beard, National Scout Commissioner, B.S.A.; (6) Ernest Thompson Seton, Chief Woodcraft of the Woodcraft League; (7) Edgar M. Robinson, Secretary, Boys' Work Department of the World Alliance of Y.M.C.A.'s; (8) Lee F. Hanmer, Recreational Director, Russell Sage Foundation; (9) General George W. Wingate, organizer of the Public Schools Athletic League of N. Y. C.; (10) Joseph Lee, father of the playground idea; (11) Howard S. Braucher, Secretary, Playground and Recreation Association of America; (12) Mortimer L. Schiff, Vice-President, B.S.A.; (13) Milton A. McRae, former President, now Vice-President, B.S.A.; (14) Frank Presbrey, Charter Member, Executive Board, B.S.A.; (15) George D. Pratt, Treasurer, B.S.A.; (16) John Sherman Hoyt, Chairman, Finance Committee, B.S.A.; (17) Dr. Jeremiah W. Jenks, Charter Member, Executive Board, B.S.A.; (18) William D. Murray, Chairman, Editorial Board, B.S.A.; (19) G. Barrett Rich, Jr., Charter Member, Executive Board, B.S.A.; (20) James E. West, Chief Scout Executive, B.S.A.; (21) Dr. George J. Fisher, Deputy Chief Scout Executive, B.S.A. Practically all the recipients of the award were active in the formation or early work of the Boy Scouts of America.

Another award, that of a bronze buffalo, similar to the silver buffalo, was presented to the International Scout Bureau, London, in honor of the Unknown Scout whose good turn to an American traveler, Mr. William D. Boyce, when searching his way in London, sometime in 1907, resulted in his taking steps to incorporate the Boy Scouts of America.
