(Appendix Updated on: September 16, 2012)

Prior to 1973 Scouts wore strips, usually red and white, on their left shoulder, denoting the city and state of their troop. Under the city strip was a shorter state strip. Colors varied depending on your shirt.



Professional Scouts wore a strip with the Council name on it. For Chehaw Council, only a red and white version is known to exist.
